SAFETY EXPO ON SUNDAY, APRIL 7

The HHIA is sponsoring a Safety Expo on Sunday, April 7 from 1-3 p.m. at the Carondelet Park RecPlex. The event is free and open to the public.

"We will offer a variety of resources related to personal safety and property security," said HHIA President Stacy Ross. "We're partnering with a number of organizations, including the RecPlex and other neighborhood organizations to bring this free event to the community."

The St. Louis Police Department will offer gunlocks. And license plate locks. Neighborhood Stabilization Officers (NSO) will have "The Club" on sale for \$13, and the St. Louis Fire Department will be on hand to discuss fire safety

and take orders for free smoke detectors installation. Representatives of the Circuit Attorney's office will discuss the Neighborhood Ownership Model and other safety issues and RecPlex staff will give a self-defense demonstration.

In addition, HHIA has invited commercial vendors such as alarm companies, so residents can compare prices and services.

"Our neighborhood is very safe," Ross said. "At the same time, we do have occasional break-ins and vandalism." Our goal is to bring factual information and best practices to residents and businesses to help them feel more confident in their safety."





HHIA MEETING MINUTES JANUARY 28, 2013

Primary election is March 5th

Peggy Meyer, Principal of Woerner So far this year, one burglary on **School** 3272 Federer and two cars broken

Woerner has 400 students, preschool – 5th grade; pull students from Holly Hills, Bevo; Feed to Long and Blow Schools; Feel free to call for a visit; 85% of students on free or reduced lunch; Woerner has single gender class rooms; Been using single gender class rooms for 2 years and so far has been successful; 22 is average class size

Captain Dan Howard

Looks positive with new Police Chief; great relationship with City Hall; tough on bad guys

So far this year, one burglary on 3272 Federer and two cars broken into in the neighborhood; There have been some issues with car break ins in YMCA lot; going to have more officers on the lot; Keep items in your car out of view; put them in the trunk

Three homicides in Dutchtown in the beginning of the year; Have suspects in custody in two of the cases; seven robberies in two-week span; six of them were people in from another neighborhood purchasing marijuana

Provided paperwork on break in statistics - times and days that are most popular for break ins (Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday midday); Also a booklet on ways to protect your home, safety tips

NOTES FROM CARONDELET PARK BOARD MEETING 1/15/13

Forest Park bonding drafted, but at a standstill, waiting for someone to pay attorney fees. No action on any other neighborhood parks – waiting until after the mayoral election. Skillman predicts another year of parks receiving ½ cent sales tax (rather than it going to pay for bonds).

Repairs on Holly Hills bridge over the railroad tracks expected to start first week of March. Expansion joints will be replaced and the deck will be overlaid. Plates will be removed.

Health Dept./Animal Control has moved out of the Gasconade

facility. Parks Dept. is working on the building and should move from Carondelet Park facility into Gasconade by end of April. The chain link fence around the maintenance area will be removed.

Lights donated by Villa Lighting will be installed at Lyle House.

Ron Bolte and Tim Bolt are looking at resources, including an expert assessment from the Audubon Society, regarding the development of a bird sanctuary in the park.

Funding for the extension of the

facility. Parks Dept. is working on bike path along I-55 into the park is the building and should move slated for next fiscal year.

Circle drive in Bellerive Park has been removed. Parks Dept. has applied to MSD for money for repairs. Gateway Greening has proposed a trail between Bellerive and Sister Marie Charles Park. Needs to be ADA accessible so it may need to be a switchback.

Measure on April ballot for 3/16 cent sales tax. Forty percent would go to regional parks/Arch and 60 percent would go to neighborhood parks. Carondelet Park would get an estimated \$50,000.

Officer Cox is a part of the neighborhood ownership program for Bevo - very successful there; One example: burglary on Morganford, Bevo residents went to sentencing of defendant and he received 20 years; Can be very successful once up and running

Top one or two things to make a priority in your home:

1. Make sure nothing valuable in sight of windows when you are not home

2. Keep trusted neighbors informed if you are out of town or gone for an extended time

Burglar alarms are useful; the noise itself can scare burglars away

Question: Can neighborhood spend money on trained people to walk the neighborhood for security? Captain Howard feels our neighborhood is safe and not to that point yet.

Brian Kolde, 11th Ward Neighborhood Stabilization Officer

Has worked a lot with neighborhood watch – different from

neighborhood ownership model, which is much more extensive

Neighborhood Watch - groups of people as neighbors being aware of what is going on on your block; Get the block to meet regularly to discuss what is going on for that block; Distributed pamphlets on how to organize your block; Happy to come to the meeting if your block is interested in getting a Neighborhood Watch together; Try to get 50% of your block to participate

Can also discuss problem properties where there are behavioral, nuisance activities continued on pa 9





2. Not allowed to use overtime employees to cover the gaps


