Success for Celebrate Carondelet Park Day

Carondelet Park on a sunny Saturday morning and found trash, trash and more trash. They picked up piles of fast-food cups and wrappers, soda cans and bottles, and the ubiquitous cigarette butts. More unexpected were a tire, an old VCR and metal rods of indeterminate origin.

"I am very gratified at the tremendous turnout," said Jim Ross, who spear-headed the clean-up on April 21. "I hope it raises

awareness and in the future when people are walking through the park, first, they'll stop and think before they litter, and second, maybe more people will pick up trash they see in the park."

The clean-up was just the first event in a fun-filled day of hot-dogs and lemonade, live music and a recycling fair, all a part of Celebrate Carondelet Day. An estimated 300 people attended throughout the day. One of the first was Mayor Francis Slay who showed up to encourage the volunteers as the clean-up was getting started. Later in the day, State Rep. Tom Villa stopped by.

More than 50 kids and adults scoured The Earth Day Eve event was organized by members of HHIA's Keep Holly Hills Beautiful Committee, in partnership with Friends of Carondelet Park. In addition to Jim Ross, committee members included: Carolyn Bellers, Nancy Economon, Tara Ohler-Jenney, Ann Repetto, Lisa Roth, Paul Sager, Heather Seitsinger and Audrey Weast, with help from Friends of Carondelet Park members Monica Groth-Farrar and Megan Everding. The event was a kick-off to the

> committee's neighborhood clean-up, litter reduction and recycling initiative.

> "Our first goal is to raise awareness and get people to quit trashing the park," said committee chair Stacy Ross. "We are going to investigate strategies to

educate people about reasons not to litter."

In addition, the committee plans to sponsor regular park clean-ups.

"There are studies that show litter begets litter," Stacy Ross said. "That is, when people see litter on the ground they are more likely to litter themselves, so we want to keep it in

Since then, two additional beds have been constructed and we have plans to build two larger perennial beds in the next couple of weeks. 11TH WARD NEWS FROM MATT VILLA

The City and a potential developer are still waiting for the Court to determine an acquisition price for 6340 S. Grand. The plan would be to upgrade the 1st floor retail spaces and gut rehab the residential apartments. The future of the project depends on the price set by the Court. If the acquisition price is too high, the developer will not move forward on the project.

Construction at Loughborough Commons continues with the sidewalks and the outparcel near Grand and Loughborough on target to be completed by August 1, 2007. Construction will begin soon on the outparcel next to Schnucks with a completion date set
