Take a stroll down tree lined boulevards and enjoy the 1920s grandeur of the Holly Hills neighborhood with our fall house tour, "Passport to the Past." Join us on Sunday, October 15 from 11:00-5:00 pm as we showcase 12 homes in our beautiful neighborhood. This selection of homes shows the wide variety of styles and locations of the homes throughout the Holly Hills neighborhood.

The Holly Hills Neighborhood was a subdivision conceived during the golden age of Hollywood, meant to capture the glamour of the Southern Californian movie-star lifestyle by developers William Federer, Gus Arendes and Don Livingston Sr. They developed the Holly Hills neighborhood into well-built, neat bungalows and flats that would predominate on most blocks and they created elegant residences that would line a gracious parkway with the showpieces facing Carondelet Park.
