

**HHIA General Meeting Notes**  
**Monday, March 22, 2010**

In attendance: Paul Sager (President), Kate Hastings (Vice President), Beth Murphy (Treasurer), Tara Ohler-Jenney (Financial Secretary), Patrick Hanlon (MAL), Richard Hutson (MAL), Stacy Ross (MAL)

Paul Sager called the meeting to order. Minutes from the January general meeting were approved.

Beth Murphy reviewed the financial report. HHIA has a balance of \$11,619.00.

Patricia Coffin, Principal of the new Carondelet Leadership Academy, spoke about the new public charter school scheduled to open in August 2010 at 7604 Michigan (formerly St. Boniface). Missouri Baptist University is the sponsor and American Quality Schools is the manager.

Charles Bryson, Director of Public Safety, spoke about services provided by his department. He is responsible for the Building Division, City Emergency Management Agency (CEMA), Division of Corrections, Excise Division, Fire Department, Neighborhood Stabilization, and the Office of Special Events.

Randy Breitenfeld, Deputy Refuse Commissioner, spoke about services provided by the Street Department and Refuse Department.

Janis Garavaglia, Executive Assistant in the Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry, spoke about services provided by the Forestry Division.

Officer Mark O'Brien from the Police Department 1<sup>st</sup> District provided updates on the ATM scams and reminded attendees that a few tickets remained for the March 23 annual luncheon honoring the District One Officer of the Year.

Matt Villa, 11<sup>th</sup> Ward Alderman, spoke about traffic studies for Grand and Bates and Grand by the Rec Center entrance; construction on the Loughborough bridge by the Loughborough Commons; replacement of the Holly Hills and Delor bridges over I-55; the Carondelet Leadership Academy; the addition of another SLPS gifted school program; and proposed development at the corner of Grand and Holly Hills.

Caroline Halyburton, Neighborhood Stabilization Officer, invited residents to attend the City Emergency Management Agency training classes.

Paul Sager reminded residents that several HHIA board positions are open. Those who would like to serve should contact him. Attendees voted not to have an annual dinner at the May meeting. A decorative tile, designed by artist Bridget Flood, featuring the Carondelet Park boathouse, will be available for purchase in the near future, with a portion of the proceeds benefiting the HHIA. Also, a book about the history of Holly Hills, by historian NiNi Harris, will be available in mid April.
