HOLLY HILLS GREEN SPACE INITIATIVE

The Holly Hills Green Space Committee (HHGSC), coordinated volunteer Saturdays in July, August and this month of September. Turnout was very low with only a couple of residents showing up to help with major naturalization projects, so our timeline for removing invasive honeysuckle, volunteer mulberry trees and weeds has been delayed. On the bright note, we should finish some bed naturalization projects on Federer Place before fall.

HHGSC is coordinating with the Parks
Department on the removal of the
defunct planter pots placed around the
neighborhood. We hope to start the
removal of the very large and heavy
pots this fall. The majority of the pots is
broken and will be recycled while a few
have been adopted by residents and
businesses who have taken on the planting and maintenance duties. A round
of thanks to them!

We have many great neighbor volunteers! Many adopted beds look fantastic (special kudos to the residents of Bellerive!) In the coming remaining weeks before cold weather, we hope to schedule weeknight events and perhaps and perhaps one more Saturday even, so watch your email! 

Guest Speakers: Circuit Attorney Jennifer Joyce and Mary Pat Carl -Initiative in the Circuit Attorney's office designed to stem gun violence in St. Louis. Fortunately not a lot of gun violence in Holly Hills, but if you watch the news almost every day is another shooting. Cities all over the country are seeing an uptick in gun crimes. She is not anti-gun, she and her husband are gun owners themselves. Not in any way opposed to the legal right to own firearms or use them in a lawful manner. My problem is gun violence. If people were killing each other at a rate with knives and forks...violence that is the problem, not it. Volunteer work. Single moms, auns. People talk about St. Louis as one of the most dangerous cities in America...it is hard to think about our city that way. Economic issue as well ...impacting universities and businesses. We all have a dog in this fight. We wanted to make a difference. Three Rs: RESOLVE (Resolve They hope to be a connector betof the community). What is the under- ween residents and resources. lying cause...issues like poverty, poor education system, social issues that form a climate where gun violence can flourish and take root, unless we address the social issues we will not Those problems will be solved with the community. If you have a gun, keep it yourself of these social services or you

car. No glove box. Keep it secured in your house. If you see crime, report young people. Charitable organizations (consider organizations that are helping young people).

Job training, GED, dangle the carrot, but make sure that they know if there is another body, they are going to jail. Technique has worked. Focused deterrent. Kansas City had a 40 year low in gun violence and credits this program with a reduction in gun violence. Is this a magic bullet? No, but one more brick in the wall. Young kids that go through the system. Prison is referred to as criminal finishing school for low level, first time offenders. Get them in a mentoring program, job skills. Give them some support and mentorship in the hopes that they will get off the wrong path. Only non-violent, low level crimes. They will be heavily screened. Hope is to turn them around and redirect them.

REMOVE - Classic role. We have been committed to removing the people from our community that are the cause of the problem. Crime strategies unit. In order to be someone that is intimidating on the street, you have to put your info out there. Gathering that public info. No spying involved. Advertising on Facebook, tweeting, etc. Created entire unit that is gathering that info. Let's

them know who is at the heart of the violence in the community. Small % of the population that is violent, but they cause ripple effects. Remove them from the community. Pass this info on to the judges. entencing memos. Lead Homicide Prosecutor position. First and foremost, she is a mom and she was getting tired of calling moms and telling them about their dead child. Regardless of whether or not the child was a participant in the crime or an innocent victim, it is a problem. She and her team are responding to homicide scenes directly with the police officers. Allows them to absorb info from the very beginning of the crime. It can change your ability to effectively prosecute the case. Each detail is incredibly important. Traditionally, the police has investigated for months and sometimes years, but the circuit attorney wasn't involved until arrest occurs. Only have 24 hours to try the case. Now, they are getting brief all along the way which will build trust with those witnesses. They will be more likely to show up in court. They will be there every step of the way up until the arrest.

Gun court question – gun court was proposed to judges. Judges did not want to do it.....continued on pg 6







That idea is no longer on the table. But this prompted them to come up with a solution that didn't involve the judges cooperation. She thinks that what they have proposed is better than the gun court. It made them go back to the drawing board and come up with a solution that will be more effective. Everybody has a part to play and everybody is affected by it.

When a homicide occurs, the sergeant will contact the Circuit Attorney and they will be on the scene. Witnesses are taken back to headquarters where they are interviewed. Also lets them build a relationship with the victim's family members. It's about building relationships.

Jamieson homicide...if the attorney would not have gone to the scene, they could not have tried that case. You have to be there and see it. They will be able to have all kinds of scene diagrams, etc. It didn't sound like an issuable case on paper, but because the attorney was there and saw it with his own eyes they were able to charge.

Triple homicide at 4467 Itaska. That case is in the works. Those people will be held accountable.

NOVA program...is that the same program that LA has been using? Our program is a little bit different.

Hold call-ins. These guys will be found through intelligence gathering, or recent parolees. Give them a choice.


Recent demonizing of policemen will help the situation? No, it's very bad. Police are like anybody. Some of the finest people that I have ever known are police officers. No profession is free of bad employees. Makes the police less desirable to engage with the public. Round of applause for the police. Vast majority of people support them. It's a bad dynamic that is happening... who knows where it will end.

Any way to find out which judges keep letting criminals back on the street? There are some resources. Main Circuit Attorney website, you can search for cases by neighborhood. You will be able to see the sentence that they asked for and the sentence that the judge gave. The sentencing memo will soon be on this website. Judges don't like her website, but it is providing transparency.

Any summarization? Some summarization, but not on the gun web site. They can't identify the judges. Most of the judges are good judges. They need to provide citizens with the tool to look up the info themselves. Circuitattorney.org

Do we lose many cases due to a lack of witnesses? Yes. continued on pg 7








Witness backed out in case where the dog was set on fire. Need citizens to be involved to provide evidence. Evidence is most often eye witness testimony.


Categories of gun violences? Trends? Drug-related crimes. We have domestic violence homicides that are separate. Most of the gun violence, open air rolling gun battles... those are gang related. There has been a resurgence in recent years. The gangs are not as organized as they once were. A lot of double-agent, switching gangs. Bizarre gang culture. Gangs fighting over territory or a perceived disrespect. Cliff notes...it is kids who are really screwed up. It is going to take everybody. Complex problem that will not be solved overnight.

Acknowledge the neighborhood. They are grateful for the neighborhood support. The protests were a little scary. Came to her home at 9:30 at night. Police came immediately. It hurt her heart. She signed up for it, but the neighborhood didn't sign up for it. She was just mortified for the neighborhood. Received so many nice notes and

support. Some lady brought baked good, handed them over to the police who ate them. Thank you. Her hope is that won't happen again. It's a good feeling to know that she has the support of the neighborhood. She dearly loves it.

Dee Brown–South Side Safety group –does not take away from your neighborhood group. Circuit Court, Rachel Smith will be there. Grants that will be available to neighborhoods for camera surveillance. Also looking into safety options.





that are fabulously wealthy. Some are so small that don't have a sales tax or a commercial corridor. No commercial district. Jobs moved out. Having trouble convincing banks that there is a reasonable reason for repayment. Economic dev: 92 different entities that do business licensing. If you want to start a small business, there are 92 different ways to do it. Not every town hall is open 9-5. It can be difficult to expand your business from one community to another. You can't spend all your time learning the process for the next town over. Unnecessary impediment. Public health: couldn't be an adversarial issue when it comes to public health. West Nile breakout in Affton affects the city of St. Louis. Public safety: broken down into smaller components. Municipal courts, fire protection study, police study. Municipal courts (20 or so courts) where 20% of the city income is coming from the court. Originating with a fine. 13 cities where the court is basically funding the city. Judges and prosecutors: small group of law firms that provide all of the services for a few municipalities. Can be prosecutor in one town and judge in another town. Can cause one to lose faith in the system. Policing: how does policing operate?





Lay of the land. We are a region of extremes. St. Louis Police Dept that cover big geographic areas and are well funded. Large depts. are able to recruit better skilled officers. Small towns that have a handful of police officers. Police Executive Research Forum. Massive 70-80 page report that outlines the harsh truths, particularly in st. Louis County. Received recommendations about how to talk about it. Solutions seem like great ideas. Combine training academies. Shared COMSTAT, so that crime stats are shared, makes communication difficult. 20 of the smaller police depts. folding their service into other larger depts... For example, several areas around U City would start employing U City police services. BetterTogetherSTL.com




Alderman Villa- Brochure has good resources and phone numbers. ake Hummel, handbook for senior citizens. Antonio French wants to investigate the taser incident. Aldermen do not have any business micromanaging what the police do in the field. Have to guit beating up on those that put their life on the line. These issues are very divisive at the board of alderman. Public Utilities committee, with Chairman French. No agenda, they just want to get organized. If you got an assessment notice. 60,000 were sent out. If you got one, your taxes went up. House on Holly Hills sold for a lot of money. If you neighbors house sells well, then your property taxes will go up. Chief Dotson has been meeting with the board of alderman. They let him have it. Counter-productive. Dotson is upset with the judiciary and he is upset with the alderman because they aren't hiring police quickly enough. Crime stats are fine, but crime isn't going down. More gunshots, more garage break ins. If we hire 20 new officers, that is \$1 million. Their salaries and pension benefits go up. Money will come from red-light camera revenue. Carondelet Commons, putting dirt in to cover the 500 year flood plain on South Broadway. Starting first building on July 1st. Standing authority spend \$750,000 on the new stadium. No one has come to the board to ask for any funding. Money came from fund to maintain existing building. He just doesn't see how they are going to pay for it. He signed a letter stating that it needed to go to a vote of the people. The governor let the county out of the funding discussion. Lot of good things in the bond issue. The good outweighs the bad. Look into the detail. St. Louis Post dispatch will break it down for us. Increase in real property. Rolling stock, new refuse trucks. Biggest share to fire dept, Chief Dotson is into drones. New building for evidence. Needs 2/3 vote. He is going to vote for it, but we really need to hold the powers that be accountable. Where the most acute need is. These numbers came from capital committee. When we hire more policeman, you are going to pay for them somehow. Extremely important that you make an educated vote. Police deployment is important to us collectively. The chief has told us that each district has the same number of officers and cars. He doesn't see that. 11% increase in 911 calls, leading the league in homicides. We all need to continue to be vigilant.


