# Minutes from the September 23 HHIA Meeting

**Present:** Anna Baldwin, Tara Ohler-Jenney, Julie Orrick, Jim Sahaida

Anna Baldwin, President, called the meeting to order at 8:05pm

#### **Guest Speakers:**

# Matt Flinner, Education & Outreach Coordinator for BBB

Mr. Flinner spoke about fraud and scams. Some of the point he made were to do your homework, report bad behavior, help those in need, and continue your education. Per BBB research they found the top three things of interest to consumers are Quality, Business Ethics, and Responsiveness. These three actually topped the length of time a company has been in business and also topped selection, compliant record, and price. . He also stated 25% of scams result in a loss of money and that women are just a bit more susceptible to scams than men. Surprisingly kids and grandkids are more susceptible to scams than older persons. Employment and romance scams are common and 45 to 65 year old women are targeted for romance scams. He stated it is risky to purchase online especially targeted scams are pets, cosmetics, autos, clothing and electronics. Risky for small businesses are scams regarding bank credit, direct listing or advertising and fake invoices. Small businesses (less than 100 employees) should also worry about staff training, verification of invoices, about being tech savvy, and being aware of imposters so know who you are dealing with. Some tips were to make payment with credit cards, watch for bad spelling and grammar as this could be a sign of scammers from foreign countries, ID spoofing, and being cautious with high pressure sale persons. An audience member stated the St. Louis Police Department has a cyber crime unit.

## Paul Whitsitt - spoke about Urban Bee Keeping

Mr. Whitsitt brought with him a beehive for display. He also said he bought a home which he tore down in his creation of an urban farm. He stated he has kept bees for five years. He currently has two bee hives. He is friends with bee keepers at the Botanical Gardens. His interest is honey bees and he described the various kind of bees and what they do such as egg layers, worker bees, and drones. He talked about how honey from bees is used by people who suffer from allergies. He is a member of a group that meets once a month that also have an interest in bees. He said helpful to bees are native plants, mowing less frequently, and minimizing the use of pesticides.

#### Steve Butz - Missouri State Representative

Mr. Butz said he has been the State Representative for nine months. The previous legislative term ended on May 17th. He briefly described a special session called by the Governor to allow multiple vehicles being able to be used regarding a trade in on another vehicle. Mr. Butz stated he is on the Transportation Committee and was able to leverage getting new replacement fencing in the area of Highway 55 and Loughborough. He is also pushing MODOT to do better collecting trash along the highway. He also spoke about he and Brooks Goedeker, an area resident, doing clean-up along Highway 55. When doing this they encountered two men Bill and Tom. These two have been homeless but were willing helpers with the clean up. A go-fund me account was set up and \$800 dollars was raised to help Bill and Tom. Bill has benefitted from the funds raised in finding housing and the hope is he will continue to do okay. Steve stated it has now been three years since Cops Walking the Beat came into existence and that a Town Hall meeting will be held at Woerner School on Thursday, November 7th at 7pm to do an update. All are invited to attend. Steve also said he was able to have a short meeting with the Governor and was able to request the Highway Patrol do patrolling on State Highways in the City. The focus of the Highway Patrol would not be ticket writing but to get traffic to slow down. Steve also said it would be safer for the Highway Patrol to handle accidents that occur on the highway.

#### Officer Steve Wilson, St. Louis City Police

Officer Wilson concurred with Representative Butz having the Highway Patrol would be a real assist. If an accident occurs on the State Highway it takes several City Police Officers and police cars out of their patrolling. He also said the City Police only have two tow trucks, on in South City and one in North City. He concurred with the Better Business speaker that often elderly are scammed with many reports to the St. Louis Police Department. He state the Holly Hills area is low on crime. He passed out a summary on crime in Holly Hills covering the period of 8-5-19 ending 9-20-19 that had a grand total of 34 crimes. The highest number was 11 crimes of Larceny and the only crime against persons was 4 Aggravated Assaults.

## Alderman Beth Murphy, 13th Ward

Money is being appropriated for an anti-crime program called "Cure Violence". Thus far \$500,000 has been appropriated by Ways and Means. More funds are being considered by the Aldermanic Public Safety Committee. Beth stated the bridge under construction to the Carondelet Y should be completed by the end of the year.

## Minutes of the September Carondelet Park Advisory Board

The meeting was called to order by Michael Dauphin at 5:00PM.

**Present**: Kim Haegele, Michael Dauphin, S. Marion Renkens, Dan Schulze, Peggy Meyer, Beth Murphy, Scott Lapp, Collin Mingo, Ted Hartzler, & Don Roe.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes of the June 18th meeting. The motion carried.

#### The board was updated on the following old business items:

Pickle Ball Courts - This project is completed. These courts are very popular and are being used regularly.

**Bridge** – Work has been started. The concrete is cut up and they are currently removing the top deck. They will then replace it with a new deck. They are hoping to complete the work by November before the weather gets too cold. The railings has been saved. They may be used for a decorative area somewhere in the park since they are original to the park.

**Lyle House** - No one bid on the RFP. It will be put out again. This has been put on hold while work is done with traffic calming and Horseshoe Lake.

## **New Business:**

Horseshoe Lake – Has duckweed that is robbing the water of oxygen. Two fish kills have occurred. Workers with the Mo. Dept. of Conservation gave recommendations for fixing the problem. A line from the comfort station has been taken to the lake. There is now water at both ends. There is also an out-structure at both ends. Aerators will be placed at both ends as well. This should take care of the problem. The lake will eventually be drained and deepened. This should all be completed by mid-October.

**Traffic Calming Project** – Beth Murphy presented a drawing of the traffic calming project. They are putting in a roundabout in front of the Lyle House. There will be a curb median through the middle of Grand Drive. There will be another roundabout near the bridge. The parkway on Holly Hills will be extended all the way to Grand Drive. Drivers will not be able to make a left turn when traveling east on Holly Hills. New curbs will be created to look natural and to allow for mowing. The goal is to maintain the integrity of the park. The cost is approximately \$225,000. A notice to proceed has been issued.

Aerators are being put into horseshoe lake at Carondelet Park to deal with algae that had been killing fish. The lake will be restocked with fish by Missouri Conservation. Beth has had some cameras installed to stop illegal dumping.

#### Alderman Sarah Martin, 11th Ward

She stated she attended a meeting today to hear more about the "Cure Violence" program. In response to a question about speed bumps being placed she stated it cannot be done just arbitrarily – a traffic speed study is required. Sarah brought with her a sketch of roundabouts that will be used at Holly Hills and Grand and near the Lyle House. This came about after a study was done and will enhance traffic flow. Requests for Proposals related to the Lyle House were put out but there was not a response.

Anna Baldwin made several announcements that included the dates and time for the Strange Folk Festival at Carondelet Park and she announced the next HHIA meeting will be November 25 at 7pm. She stated there will be a HHIA Holiday Party on December 15 with more details to come.

The meeting adjourned at 8:40pm






